PASTOR'S CORNER

"A flower cannot blossom without sunshine, and man cannot live without love" Max Muller

As my time at Enslow Park draws inexorably to an end, I have been ruminating on my "final instructions" which I would like to leave with you. The realm of potential topics is endless. Maybe I should get motivational and instruct you to seize the day – to not waste a moment of your lives on trivial matters but to embrace life and go for the glory. Maybe I should encourage you to embrace a spirit of gratitude, for the extent of our blessings are far more than we should ever have deserved. But the *piece de resistance* of my message to my EPPC friends centers not on my own words but rather on the words of our Lord Jesus Christ. For it is to these words that you should cleave. So let's take a look at what Jesus tells us in the Gospel of John:

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments." (14:15)

"Whoever has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me. And he who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him." (14:21)

"If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him." (14:23)

"Whoever does not love me does not keep my words. And the word that you hear is not mine but the Father's who sent me." (14:24)

"But I do as the Father has commanded me, so that the world may know that I love the Father." (14:31) "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love." (15:9, 10)


"This is my commandment. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in His love, that you love one another as I have loved you." (15:12)

"Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends." (15:13)

"These things I command you, so that you will love one another." (15:17)

Now I will confess that I'm not always the sharpest knife in the drawer; yet even a dullard such as myself finds it darn near impossible to read these Gospel messages and not stumble upon their thematic core! The simple fact is that if you count yourself a follower of Jesus, it's safe to say that you're on a mission of love. So remember the "sine qua non" (without which nothing) of your faith. Hold close to the greatest commandment to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength." and to, "Love your neighbor as yourself." for "There is no commandment greater than these." Proudly display the particular brand of Agapic love which Jesus showed for us. Cleave to it. Practice it daily. Extend it to others. Make it the center post of your lives. Simply put: try, as best as you are able, to be a true and faithful follower of Jesus Christ our Lord.

The committee is considering the possibility of having Rodrigo Almeida, our Outreach Coordinator, be in charge of visiting our congregation, both at home and in the hospital as well as teaching Sunday School as he is now doing.

"Recipe of the Month" Cheeseball with Red Raspberry Jam

Ingredients:

2 c. Shredded sharp cheddar

2 c. Shredded mozzarella

8 oz. Block cream cheese

1 c. Chopped pecans

1 c. Hellmann's light mayo



4 green onions – mostly white part and a little green

Directions:

Mix cheeses with a fork; add mayo and mix again. Add remaining ingredients stirring until well mixed. Form into a ball or place in a round serving container and refrigerate. When ready to use, set out an hour before serving to soften a little and spread a small amount of seedless red raspberry jam on top. Don't put too much jam but add more needed while serving. Serve assorted crackers.
