PASTOR'S CORNER

"The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace." ~ Numbers 6:24-26 ~

As you know I am retiring at the end of the year and I just wanted to take this time to thank all of you for the many ways you allowed me to be your pastor. In Nine and 2/3 years I've watched children grow up. I've baptized, performed marriages, visited hospitals and shut-ins, taught theology as well as performing far too many funerals. Together, we realized a few dreams, lived through a few trials, and persevered. As the years go by I will look back fondly on our time together; I trust the same will be true for you.

While I am leaving you, there is one who remains constant: Jesus Christ. Jesus has been here from the beginning, and will be with you for the rest of time. If through the power of the Holy Spirit you allow Jesus to guide (you) EPPC will always have a mission. It may not look like the church we have today. There will undoubtedly be trials to be endured and difficult decisions which need to be made. But a passion for our Lord and Savior will see you through.

The biblical record is full of stories about people who faced far harder trials than we. A few times the people of Israel were exiled from their land; every time they returned. When Elijah was on the run from King Ahab and Queen Jezebel he prayed, "I've been very passionate for the LORD God of heavenly forces because the Israelites have abandoned your covenant. They have torn down your altars, and they have murdered your prophets with the sword. I'm the only one left, and now they want to take my life too."

The LORD heard Elijah's prayer and encouraged him with these words: "I have preserved those who remain in Israel, totaling seven thousand– all those whose knees haven't bowed down to Baal and whose mouths haven't kissed him." When Elijah had done the math it looked to him like it was all over. But God's math was different from Elijah's. God made a way where there was no way, and God will do it again for people who have faith. There is something really wonderful about the word, *advent*. When you Google the word, one of the definitions you get is: the arrival of a notable person, thing or event. We know this word from other contexts besides religions. We say things like, "Since the advent of the automobile" Or "Since the advent of the modern era . . ." So at root the message is quite simple: Advent means something new is coming.

In a Christian context we look to Advent at the dawn of a new and better era – a message which translates quite naturally into Christmas. So it is appropriate that in this season of hope we hold fast to belief that EPPC will find a new and better era as well. So I bid you goodbye with, appropriately, my favorite Celtic blessing: "May the road rise up to meet you. May the wind be always at your back. May the sun shine warm upon your face; the rains fall soft upon your fields and until we meet again, may God hold you in the palm of His hand."






Christian Associates Cridlin Food & Clothing Pantry has asked EPPC to contribute:
