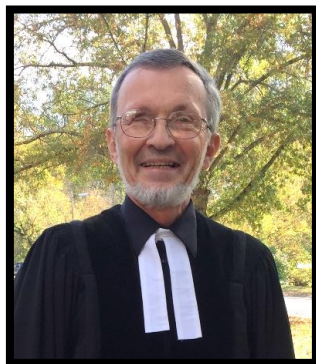

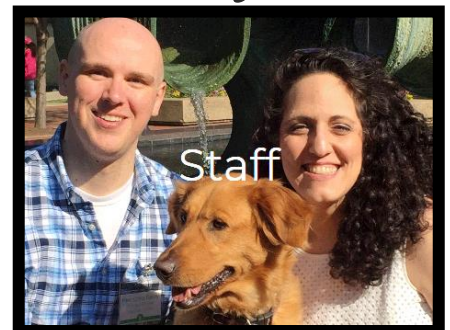


Eric Springer, a native Huntingtonian, grew up as a member of First Presbyterian Church. He graduated from Huntington High School and Marshall University with a

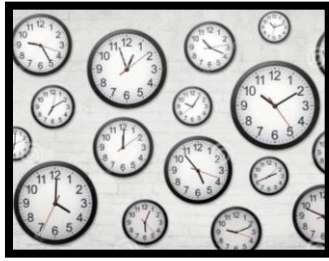
Rev. Chris Bailey

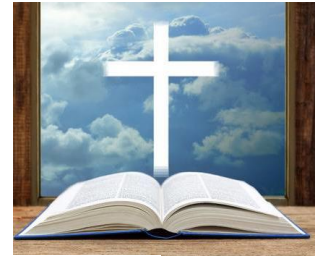

Recipe of the Month:

"Spiced Fruit Compote"

A Family Favorite

Ingredients:

- ~ 2 large oranges, peeled & cut into large pieces
- ~ 30 oz. can apricots, drained
- ~ 2 29 oz. cans pear halves or slices, drained
- ~ 1 ½ cups orange juice
- ~ 2-3 short cinnamon sticks
- ~ ½ tsp. salt
- ~ ¼ cup sugar
- ~ 12 whole cloves
- ~ ¼ tsp. ginger

Directions:

Into a large bowl, add the oranges, apricots & pears. In sauce pan, mix OJ, sugar, cinnamon, cloves, salt and ginger. Simmer 5 minutes – medium heat. Pour over fruit and refrigerate at least 2 hours before serving. Makes 8 servings. Enjoy!

The Fellowship Team Thanks All who have given their time and effort to provide a delicious snack and fellowship time before worship!

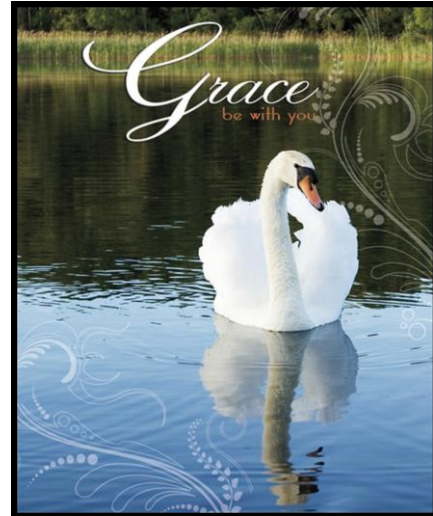
